THE TAHLTAN-PACIFIC BRAND TAKES FLIGHT

TNDC's logo has taken to the skies! The maiden voyage of the Tahltan-Pacific charter flight with the TNDC wolf and crow logo proudly featured on the tail of the Saab 340B, landed in Dease Lake on October 26. The charter service, operated by Pacific Coastal Airlines, carries up to 34 Red Chris Mine employees and flies daily Monday to Friday to/from Dease Lake. Tahltan-Pacific is TNDC's joint venture with Pacific Coastal Airlines, a British Columbia-based airline. Imperial Metals is the first Tahltan-Pacific customer and flights for Red Chris launched in May 2015. With the number of existing and proposed resource development projects in the region steadily growing, having quick, easy and reliable access to the region is becoming increasingly important. TNDC's longer-term goal for Tahltan-Pacific is to expand to include regular scheduled service for residents and other government and industry people working in the region. Read more
